Preventing Child Abuse Is Everyone's Responsibility

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month. Every adult has a moral responsibility to report suspected child abuse. In Kentucky, state law requires that <u>any person</u> who knows or has reasonable cause to believe that a child is neglected or abused must immediately report the abuse. Sexual abuse of minors is a pervasive societal problem, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. Did You Know?

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month. Did you know that more than five children die every day as a result of child abuse, and that a report is made every ten seconds? In addition, as many as one in four girls and one in six boys will be sexually abused at some point in their childhoods; one in seven youth (10 to 17 years old) have received a sexual solicitation or approach over the Internet, and 88% of sexual abuse cases are never reported.
