News from FOCCUS

COMING! Changes to 85% of Previous Inventory

The last major revision of the FOCCUS Inventory was in 1997. Preparation for this latest edition was extensive and seeks to meet "the real life needs of today's couples and those who are preparing them for marriage."



Changes to look for in FOCCUS 4th Edition:

- · Questions that address pornography, technology, prayer in marriage, and pets
- A fourth special issue Couples with Children. This will directly address issues of first and subsequent marriages
- Technology updates to insure 24/7 access to the FOCCUS website where facilitators can easily download and print couple answer sheets in English and Spanish at no charge, along with Couple Reports, b'tween resources that include a Reflection and Discussion Guide, FOCCUS for the Future, and a Couple Completion Certificate.

The FOCCUS 4^{th} Edition Facilitator manual with two couple inventories of the facilitator's choice will be offered at a 50% discount if ordered between now and June, 2014. After this date they will be \$50.

You may pre-order NOW! The Family Ministries Office will send a preorder form to each parish by way of email and a hard copy through the Chancery mailing. You will need one manual for each of your current facilitators and facilitating couples.

The FOCCUS 4th Edition may not be used prior to January 6, 2014. Please continue using the current edition until then.

Although the material is changing, the process and procedures for using FOCCUS are not changing. Therefore, no Diocesan retraining sessions are being considered at this time. You may however wish to convene all your parish facilitators for coffee, dessert, distribution and conversation around the changes.

Coping with the Holidays

You are facing the holidays for the first time without your loved one and this can bring pain to your heart and tears to your eyes. Here are a few ideas to help you be gentle with your pain and cope with both memories and expectations.

- 1. Focus on the present moment. Instead of worrying about "how it's going to be" take one day at a time.
- 2. Pay attention to what you want to do, rather than what you think others expect of you. Be kind to yourself.
- 3. Relive the happy memories. Focus on the sweetness of past holidays, even if it triggers tears.
- 4. Balance solitude with social times. Being alone can quiet and strengthen you. When you choose to be with people, choose those whom you trust to love and accept you as you are.
- 5. Take a chance that you might actually enjoy doing something different. Have your special holiday dinner at a different home or even eat out. The more you try to make it the same as the past, the more obvious your loss will be.
- 6. Use "gift money" you would have spent on your loved one to contribute to a cause he or she loved.
- 7. Let yourself give to others, not out of effort but out of the natural love that still exists in you.
- 8. Let yourself be surprised by the goodness and wonder that the holidays can bring. Miracles can happen when you let your heart be open to the love around and within you.

New Pro-Life Coordinator - introducing Ed Harpring



A few months ago, I would never have dreamed that I would be the new Pro-Life Coordinator for the Archdiocese of Louisville. As the saying goes, "If you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans." My name is Ed Harpring, and being a corporate business professional for the last 25 years, and now moving into the non-profit sector, has truly been

a leap of faith. However, despite God's sense of humor, I am excited and energized by the opportunity to serve the Church and my faith community.

While my day job has been in business, I have spent the last 30 years actively involved in Pro-Life issues. Through my home parish, St. Barnabas, my wife and I have co-chaired our Social Concerns Committee for nearly 15 years. Through this committee, we have worked with our parishioners in supporting many Life Issues, including Helpers of God's Precious Infants, 40 Days for Life, Catholic Charities' Mother-Infant Care Program, and the annual Little Way rose sale. Our oldest son, Russell, is a Speed School graduate as well, and has spent the last 18 months doing service work for the Salesians in The Dominican Republic and San Antonio Texas. He also spent 3 months working at the United Nation headquarters in Geneva, Switzerland. Our younger son, Paul, is working in Louisville, and our "baby," Rebecca, is a junior at Bellarmine University.

I take it as a good sign that I began my Pro-Life Coordinator position in the month of October — Respect Life Month. I encourage all of us to continue to celebrate Respect Life Month year round and to ponder the theme, a favorite of Pope Francis, "Open Your Hearts to Life."

This theme offers us a refreshing reminder of the sanctity of all human life from conception to natural death.

Promoting the full spectrum of Pro-Life Issues is a daunting challenge that will require the continued and united support of all of us. With your help, and the grace of the Holy Spirit, I look forward to serving the Louisville Archdiocese and promoting the Gospel of Life.


