Fall can be a great time to further your evangelization efforts. Here a few suggestions:

- "Come and See" Sunday for anyone who would like to observe and experience a Catholic liturgy. Ask parishioners to seek out Catholics who have left the church, inviting them to "come and see." Provide invitation cards to parishioners and/or enlist names and addresses and send the invitation in the name of the parish. Advertise in your neighborhoods using flyers, invitations, posters, door hangers, etc.
- Welcome New Movers One in five Americans move each year. Utilize real estate listings in local newspapers and from real estate agents or subscribe to NEW MOVERS MAILING LISTS from Paulist Evangelization Ministries (202) 832-5022. Send a letter or postcard to those moving to your area that includes a welcome message from you along with a brochure designed especially for new parishioners, a parish bulletin, and/or any other information that will attract the attention of new movers. You also may include a response device so that the new mover can easily reply to the letter. This return card can have boxes to check with items such as, "I would like a call from a parish representative," and "I would like a visit from a parish representative." Include a modified version of this postcard as a response form on your website.

Consider trying one or more of the following:

- Set up a <u>Facebook</u> page ask for prayer requests, post your homily, ask for feedback.
- Create a <u>Twitter</u> account tweet the readings, invite to upcoming Mass and/or events, share a weekly message.
- Create a <u>YouTube</u> channel for the parish record the homilies, Baptisms, Confirmations, special events, and your message for the week. Invite parishioners to record a witness talk.
