Report on Mission

Archdiocesan Response to Sexual Abuse

The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People provides a comprehensive framework for addressing allegations of sexual abuse and for creating safe environments in parishes and schools, and it directs all sexual abuse policies and procedures in the Archdiocese of Louisville. In August of 2012, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops audited our Archdiocese for the ninth time and as was determined in each previous audit, the Archdiocese of Louisville was found to be fully compliant with all elements of the Charter with no required changes or recommendations for changes.

Prevention/Education

3,248 employees and volunteers participated in safe environment training during the past fiscal year. Seventy-seven workshops were offered this past year and continue to be offered each month throughout the Archdiocese. For more information, see www.archlou.org/safe.

The sexual abuse policies and safe environment materials were updated and revised.

For Sexual Abuse Prevention Month in April, the Archdiocese sent suggested bulletin blurbs about sexual abuse to parishes and schools.

All parishes and schools were audited and all updated the comprehensive database that tracks criminal background records checks and verification of attendance at safe environment training sessions for all employees and volunteers who work with children and youth.
