Presenter:

Rev. Robert Ray was born on a farm in rural Kentucky on August 7, 1943. Seminary formation took place at St. Thomas, Louisville, KY and St. Marys' Seminary and University, Baltimore, MD. Ordained May 17, 1969, his ministry has included campus ministry, retreat work with high school and college youth, spiritual direction, parish ministry, and retreats for priests and parishes.

Fr. Bob served as pastor in a multi-cultural parish (Anglo, Vietnamese, African). He pastored two parishes through a merger process before retiring in June 2013.

In his retirement years, Fr. Bob continues the ministry of spiritual direction which began as a vocation, 40 years ago, while serving on the staff of St. Meinrad School of Theology. Fr. Bob is on contract as a spiritual director for St. Luke Center, Louisville, KY sponsored by St. Luke Institute, Silver Spring, MD. St. Luke offers therapy, spiritual direction, and continuing formation for the well-being of priests and religious. St. Luke also provides assessments for candidates for priesthood, diaconate, and religious life.

Requirements for Catechetical Ministry

The concentration in Catechetical Ministry exists to form persons in their catechetical ministries to adults, youth, or children in the Archdiocese of Louisville. This formational process fosters the acquisition of appropriate applied knowledge and skills as well as the continued spiritual formation of catechists.

PARTICIPANTS

Persons called to minister in a formal way by proclaiming and teaching God's Word are encouraged to participate in catechetical formation, specifically Catholic School Teachers of Religion/Theology, Parish Catechists (of Adults, Youth or Children), Parish Catechetical Leaders, Coordinators of RCIA, Principals, Youth Ministers, Campus Ministers, and Adult Faith Formation Leaders.

REQUIREMENTS

There are three levels within the concentration. Additional hours taken in each level will be applied to the next level. Coursework may be taken through the Archdiocese of Louisville Ministry Institute (ALMI), media options, online courses, or other **pre-approved** offerings. No more than 20 percent (40 hours) of the required coursework may be completed on an individual basis; the remaining requirements must be fulfilled through live, gathered offerings and interactive online options.

LEVEL I - ASSOCIATE CATECHIST (completion of 20 hours in the following coursework plus ongoing formation)

In addition to Overview of Catechetical Ministry Part 1, no more than 5 hours may be taken either online or as a media option for the completion of the Associate Level.



The course on Vocation, Spirituality and Discipleship of the Catechists guides the participants to look into the beginning, trace the unfolding of their vocation to the ministry of catechesis and reflect its implications in actual catechetical praxis. Mary is presented as the exemplar catechist who shows the way to respond to their call "to be and to live" as divine images, children of God, and followers of Jesus, members of God's Family the Church.
