MR. ROB TICHY SPOKE AT OUR MAY 20 MEETING

Our speaker at this meeting was Mr. Rob Tichy, a certified catechist who helps with religious education at St. John Paul II parish.

Rob was born in Louisville but grew up in Florida until he was 16. When he moved back here in 1986, he was going to St. Pius parish for a while, the Cathedral for a few years in the 90's, and then back to St. Pius later.

His mother, a great example of Catholic faith, was the Director of Religious Education at both St. Albert the Great and Holy Trinity parish. His dad worked most of his life with KFC and retired from Papa Johns.

Rob graduated from St. X in 1988. He went to Speed School at U of L, graduating in 1994. He got his MBA from Sullivan University in 2003.

Rob and his wife Linda will celebrate their 25th anniversary in August. They have four children, all here in Louisville. Rob is a computer analyst with UPS, and has worked there for 29 years

Rob spoke on teaching catechism to eighth graders in the religious education program – students who don't attend Catholic schools but are keeping up with their faith.

In 2006, Rob had two children in grade school at public schools. Jack Clark was the religious ed coordinator at St. Pius X parish at the time. He asked Rob, who had no real teaching experience but did have some coaching experience, to assist with the religious ed program; and Rob eventually ended up helping with eighth graders. Rob always wanted to pass on his faith to his own children; and while working with public school students in the religious ed programs, Rob decided to become a certified catechist.

He learned to get youth to open up by asking questions at the beginning of the school year – questions about favorite time of year, book, music, singing group, what they thought were the world's big-

gest problems, etc. Years ago, discussion of the September 11, 2001 terrorist bombing generated a lot of discussion.

Initially he stuck with the text books, but eventually began working into the program additional ideas from such things as Matthew Kelly's books, and Fr. Ron Knott's columns in The Record. (Fr. Ron Knott presided at the marriage of Rob and his wife.) Some of Rob's favorite books by Matthew Kelly are "Rediscover Catholicism" and "The Biggest Lie in the History of Christianity."

In "Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic," Matthew Kelly speaks of daily prayer, constantly learning our faith, generosity, and evangelization. Rob reminds our youth of these points and tries to practice them

himself.

He speaks of Fr. Ron Knott talking about the "rich new soil" in the Church, that what is at stake is worth the effort, and that not even hell can prevail against the Church.

Rob has also taken the youth on trips to the Cathedral; talked about the lives of the saints; had the students lead prayer

services; reminded the youth that we are all called to holiness; and organized All Saints Day costume parades at Mass. One year, wearing all gray, he surprised people when he announced that he was "the Rock" – i.e., Peter the Apostle.

His classes also discuss Catholic social justice, the liturgical calendar and much more. He's most proud of those students who have come back to help in later years with the religious ed program or as lectors, servers, Eucharistic ministers, hospitality ministers, cantor, etc. Even his own daughter, at age 22, has become a catechist for third graders while working nights at UPS; and two of his sons are often lectors at their parish

Rob reminds the students of the story of Matthew, who, after finally seeing the post-Resurrection Jesus, heard Christ say "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." (John 20:29) We don't get the opportunity to see Christ as St. Thomas did; but our faith can be just as strong.

We want to thank Rob Tichy for his time and all he does to keep the faith alive in our younger Catholics.

Costly grace is the gospel which must be sought again and again, the gift which must be asked for, the door at which a man must knock. Such grace is costly because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs a man his life, and it is grace because it gives a man the only true life."
