The Paradigm is Shifting ...Instructional Model: If young people KNOW what is

- true, they will DO what is right.
- BUT instruction without lived experience will be irrelevant!
- Experiential Model: If young people DO what is right, then they will want to KNOW what is true.
 - BUT experience without knowledge about our faith will soon wither!
- Formational Model: Comprehensive approach combining experience and knowledge ...

Conversation as accompaniment

Safe spaces for deep conversations ... and listening to stories

- Questions and doubts can be shared
- Non-judgmental
- Listen to understand ... (vs. respond)



- Open, honest, candid Hospitality
- Faith is a journey... ... questions are a sign of
- going deeper!

ACCOMPANIMENT

Move beyond dictation and doctrinization.

- Go deeper/quicker. Address the issues and questions that young Catholics are thinking about at earlier and earlier ages.
 - Move from orthodoxy to orthopraxis
 - Create a catechesis of current events ... connecting life to faith.
 - Faith sharing
 - It's about Jesus!
