TWO OF OUR SEMINARIANS WILL BE ORDAINED AS TRANSITIONAL DEACONS LATER THIS YEAR.

Quan Nguyen was born in 1988 in Vietnam. He is the fourth of five children, having one brother and three sisters. His parents still live in Vietnam and his older sister and a younger sister are nuns of the Sacred Heart of Jesus Congregation. Quan has two nephews.

He started the seminary at the age of 23 and completed five years in Vietnam. After coming to the U.S. to further his seminary education, he took English at U of L starting in the fall of 2016. Then he started at St. Meinrad the fall of 2017.

In the summer of 2018, he worked with Fr. Jeff Shooner at St. Patrick parish. The following summer he lived at St. Agnes par-

ish with Fr. David Colhour, C.P. and did Chaplaincy CPE at Baptist Hospital.

This summer he is living and doing summer ministry in St. Margaret Mary parish. It is now expected that he'll be ordained a deacon on November 28 of this year. He hopes to graduate from St. Meinrad in the Spring of 2021 and be ordained a priest on May 29, 2021.

Loi Pham was born in 1986. He grew up on a farm in Ha Tinh, Vietnam. He is the fifth of six children. He has two sisters and three brothers – all married. His parents are living in his hometown. Loi has 14 nieces and nephews.

In 2011, Loi joined St. Francis Xavier seminary at age 25 after having completed all his college undergrad work in Vietnam. His diocese in Vietnam has a relationship with the Archdiocese of Louisville, and it was arranged for him to come to Louisville in 2016. Beginning that fall, he studied English for one year at U of L, and then started at St. Meinrad for theology in the fall of 2017.

He's had the opportunity to go back to Vietnam and spend time with family in June of 2018. That summer he was assigned to St. Michael parish, working with Fr. Dick Sullivan. That summer he was also involved with youth ministry, including out-of-town trips with their youth.

For the summer of 2019, he was assigned to St. Joseph parish, working with Fr. David Sanchez. He also did Chaplaincy CPE at Baptist Hospital.

This summer he is being assigned to Mary Queen of Peace parish, working with Fr. Peter Bucalo.

It is now expected that he'll be ordained a deacon on November 28 of this year. He hopes to graduate from St. Meinrad in the Spring of 2021 and be ordained a priest on May 29, 2021.

ALTAR SERVER AWARDS
FROM THE SERRA CLUB

As with last year, we invited all Archdiocesan parishes and grade schools to work with us on this recognition. The purpose was to thank the eighth-grade graduates for their dedication and devotion in serving at the Eucharist by giving them a certificate that is signed by the Pastor as well as the President of the Serra Club of Louisville. **Twelve parishes** chose to participate this year; and Altar Server Awards were given to **77 graduating eighth grade servers**.

We hope this recognition is a reminder of their service to the Church and will encourage them to continue serving as they transition into high school.



This recognition is totally separate from the Fall Altar Server Recognition Liturgy which the Vocations Office will hold later this year.

POPE FRANCIS SPOKE TO
YOUTH ABOUT VOCATION
AND DISCERNMENT IN
"CHRIST IS ALIVE"

In 2019, Pope Francis issued the exhortation "*Chris is Alive*" to our youth and all leaders of youth. (I've been meaning to study the exhortation and write this article for a year; and it took a pandemic for me to get around to it. – Editor)

Part of his message is "Take risks, even if it means making mistakes. Don't go through life anaesthetized or approach the world like tourists. Make a ruckus! Cast out the fears that paralyze you, so that you don't become young mummies. Live! Give yourselves over to the best of life! Open the door of the cage, go out and fly! Please, don't take early retirement." (Paragraph 143)

The document is worth checking out. The Pope spoke on a number of topics, including young people in Scripture, Jesus as a youth, the experiences of young people, a great message for young people, the paths for youth, the roots of young people, youth ministry, vocation and discernment.

A few other good quotes from this document are:

- * “A wise young person is open to the future, yet still capable of learning something from the experience of others.” (Par. 16)
- * “A Church always on the defensive, which loses her humility and stops listening to others, which leaves no room for questions, loses her youth and turns into a museum.” (Par. 41)
- * “See Jesus as happy, overflowing with joy. Rejoice with him as with a friend who has triumphed. They killed him, the holy one, the just one, the innocent one, but he triumphed in the end. Evil does not have the last word. Nor will it have the last word in your life, for you have a friend who loves you and wants to triumph in you. Your Savior lives.” (Par. 126)
- * “Friendship is one of life’s gifts and a grace from God. Through our friends, the Lord refines us and leads us to maturity. Faithful friends, who stand at our side in times of difficulty, are also a reflection of the Lord’s love, his gentle and consoling presence in our lives. The experience of friendship teaches us to be open, understanding and caring towards others, to come out of our own comfortable isolation and to share our lives with others.” (Par. 151)
- * “... Friendship with Jesus cannot be broken. He never leaves us, even though at times it appears that he keeps silent” (Par. 153-154).
- * “You have to discover who you are and develop your own way of being holy, whatever others may say or think. Becoming a saint means becoming more fully yourself, becoming what the Lord wished to dream and create, and not a photocopy.” (Par. 162)
- * “We need to ask: Do I know myself, quite apart from my illusions and emotions? Do I know what brings joy or sorrow to my heart? What are my strengths and weaknesses? These questions immediately give rise to others: How can I serve people better and prove most helpful to our world and to the Church? What is my real place in this world? What can I offer to society? Even more realistic questions then follow: Do I have the abilities needed to offer this kind of service? Could I develop those abilities?” (Par. 285)
- * “In the end, good discernment is a path of freedom that brings to full fruit what is unique in each person,

something so personal that only God knows it.” (Par. 295)
