SERRAN KEN PEET SPOKE AT OUR MAY 1 MEETING REGARDING THE JANUARY RALLY IN TEXAS.

Serran Ken Peet is a retired engineer who owned his own firm for 25 years before selling it and retiring in 2011. He's been a Serran now for 10 years. He has been married to his wife Patricia "Pat" for 55 years! The two of them belong to St. Gabriel parish.

They have three daughters and seven grandchildren; and their first

great grandchild (a boy) was born in January.

For our St. Serra Club, Ken has held the positions of Secretary, District Governor, Regional Director, and Club Representative with the Serra Foundation. Ken has represented our club in meetings in our state district, as well as meetings in our four-state Great Lakes

Region. He has attended national and international Serra conventions, as well as US Serra Rallies.

Ken spoke at the May 1 meeting to give us updates on the January Rally in Irving, Texas (a suburb of Dallas) – primarily on what happens at a Rally.

On Wednesday, registrations began; and the USA Council (USAC) board meeting (open to all), ran from 1 to 5 pm. (The USAC board actually meets four times per year.)

At the board meeting, USAC President Mike Downey spoke of his five priorities for his two-year term (which ends later this year): (1) increasing the culture of vocations in Hispanic Catholic communities; (2) getting more schools and parishes involved with vocation activities; (3) encouraging clubs to inform and involve their bishops and vocation directors in



their annual program planning; (4) recruiting more Serrans in the 45 to 55 age range; and (5) starting five new clubs in the U.S.

At 5:30 there was a Mass for the early arrivers, with regular sessions starting the next morning.

All Rally attendees were expected to do a one-hour Eucharistic Adoration during the Rally, with adoration going on 24/7 during the conference. And Mass was available every day. There were four

> bishops and a number of priests in attendance for the Rally, as well as members of the boards of both USAC and Serra International (SI).

> Thursday there was the SI board meeting (open to all), from 9 am to 4 pm. There was an evening welcome reception.

Cardinal Collins is a great speaker; and

you should be sure to hear his presentation. Here is a <u>link</u> to nine of the presentations made at the Rally.

Friday had a keynote speaker and a Mass offsite, at the Dallas Cathedral.

Saturday there were more speakers, with newsletter awards distributed during the luncheon that day. At 4 pm that day, the Rally was wrapped up with a special Mass, concelebrated by several priests and bishops. The Mass was beautifully handled with great musicians and cantor. The coat and tie closing

banquet was held Saturday evening.

Throughout the Rally, there were also training sessions, meals, and workshops.

Why go to a Rally? Ken said it's great for inspiration; to get pumped up to hear great speakers; and to learn a lot of details and best practices.

The Annual Rally is held in the same city two years in a row. So, for 2024 and 2025, plan on attending in Miami Florida. The next one will be January 18-21, 2024.

In addition to all the above, Ken also gave us insight into other related matters.

USAC is interacting with **F.O.C.U.S.** (the Fellowship of Catholic University Students), which, in January, had a 15,000-person SEEK23 convention in St. Louis, including 300 seminarians and hundreds of priests. USAC had a booth at the convention.

We can expect a \$4 increase in the <u>annual</u> dues that clubs pay (effective in 2024), per member, for <u>both</u> USAC and SI – increasing from the current \$92 (USAC & SI combined) to \$100. Each club will decide separately if it will also increase its local dues. USAC and SI have not raised dues since 2012. The St. Serra Club of Louisville has not had an increase in



dues since 2016.

Both USAC and SI have offices in Chicago. There will be a consolidation of these offices in the near future; and those two offices are seeking to replace two people who left recently.

From 2015 to 2022, we lost 7,700 members and

picked up 7,500 new members across the country.

Serra is considering an analysis of the different causes for members leaving, many of which may simply be due to deaths.

USAC now has its first Zoom-only club – which meets only by Zoom due to the geographic spread of all its members in the Crookston Diocese of Minnesota.

Serra **SPARK** is expected to have several new tools added (including our own Vocation Poster and Essay Contest).

Ken also spoke of organizing a Regional Convention.

We want to thank Ken Peet for all his volunteer time and updating us on the Rally and other aspects of the Serra organization.

missionary; 11 years as a development director; three years as the president/founder of a Catholic development consulting firm; and, for the last seven years, as Executive Director of The Labouré Society – working exclusively with philanthropic training and support of future priests, sisters and brothers in the Catholic church.

The title of his presentation was "From Burdens to Blessings - Can Student Loan Debt Foster a Culture of Vocations?"



John spoke of how student debt is in the news a lot these days. And sometimes it's not until in or after college that some young men and women decide they may be called to a religious vocation. And yet 42% of these peo- Nouwen. ple can't proceed with the necessary religious formation before addressing their college debt.

want to be a burden

on dioceses or religious orders, most of which can't afford the cost of the aspirant's religious formation and paying off the college debt those aspirants have already accumulated. Most Religious institutions don't even have their retirement plans fully funded.

The Labouré Society (named after St. Catherine of Labouré) can help with that issue. As stated on their website: "The Labouré Society exists to provide financial assistance and spiritual support to individuals who must resolve education loans in order to pursue a vocation to the priesthood and/or religious life in the Catholic Church."

The aspirants are taught how to raise funds, which, as John says, is as unattractive to most people as getting teeth pulled or speaking in public at first. However, it is a treasured experience when they have completed the classes.

Every six months, they teach and inspire a class of young men and women (typically 20 to 25) to contact people with their vocation message and seek help in raising funds to retire their college debts. Labouré teaches communication, letter writing, fund

raising, time management, leadership, and growth in communal life. The aspirants work as a team, learning to overcome the fear of public speaking, and typically share their story with over 300 people. Their process is "invitational and evangelistic."

People who decide to support these young men and women become donors. Each dollar raised goes to pay off college debt. Funds raised directly by Labouré itself, and not by the aspirants, go to pay the salaries and overhead of the support staff of 12 people, four of whom are part-time. The Labouré Society is a 501(c)(3)organization; and all donations are tax deductible.

Lay individuals can also be of help by volunteering to mentor individuals going through the process. Sometimes the mentors are called "Accountability Partners." Greg Schwietz, President of Serra International, said he volunteers time to do exactly that, having worked with five aspirants. Richard Ariens, USA Council Past President, also has done some mentoring. They say that it's often just a phone conversation, maybe an hour a week.

All the Labouré activities are compliant with IRS rules as well as Church Canon Law. They also use the book "<u>A Spirituality of Fundraising</u>" by Henri

Labouré Society assists with debts of any size (one was for \$300,000), working with any number of candidates. After an aspirant is approved to go through the program, and once the funds are raised *and* the aspirant has entered a religious formation institute, then Labouré The aspirants don't makes the regular monthly debt payments, typically for 36 months. Then, if the aspirant is still working on his or her religious formation after that period of time, a balloon payment for the balance of all the debt is made in the 37<sup>th</sup> month. If the aspirant were to drop out anytime during those 36 months, then she or he takes over the balance of the debt, and any remaining funds already raised through Labouré are applied toward future classes of aspirants.

> John said that we Serrans can help in several ways: First, refer anyone to Labouré if we think the young person could be helped by them. Second, invite local aspirants to our club meetings to tell their stories. Third, for those who feel able to mentor young people, sign up to help in that way. Fourth, Serrans can always help with financial donations.

## CALLING ALL MENTORS FOR IGNITE WORKSHOP PARISHES

At the May 13 <u>Serra</u> <u>Meets</u> Zoom presentation, **Dr. Anne Roat** (President-Elect of the USA Council) also spoke; and her brief announcement was that she needs mentors for parishes (all over the country) that have gone through the INGITE Workshop. She made several points.

She said that what makes IGNITE workshops

successful are the mentors. After several parishioners attend an IGNITE workshop, the parish is assigned a Serra Club mentor, who can come from anywhere in the country, but ideally from a nearby Serra Club.

The mentor attends a 45-minute online webinar to learn how to be a mentor.

The mentor accompanies the parish for one year, typically calling a parish contact person once a month to check in on their status, asking how the parish vocation ministry is coming along, answering questions, and asking if there's anything they can help with usually taking 30 to 45 minutes per month.

## SERRAN CHUCK LYNCH SPOKE ON PARISH VOCATION MINISTRY AT OUR MAY 15 MEETING.

Chuck Lynch, our VP of Communications, spoke on matters related to how Serrans can be mentors to parishes, after our Archdiocese hosts an IGNITE Workshop on September 9 of this year. We will have USA Council officials Dr. Anne Roat (USA Council President-Elect) and Gino Dimattia (USA Council Secretary) speak to representatives of some of our parishes. The idea is to help form Parish Vocation Ministries (PVMs, aka Parish Vocation Committees).

The four basic categories of promoting vocations are (1) Awareness Tools – to make people aware of all aspects of our vocation needs; (2) Prayer Tools – various ways to pray for vocations; (3) Affirmation Tools – for affirming and thanking priests, deacons, sisters, brothers and seminarians; and (4) Invitation/ Encouragement Tools – for encouraging those who might be good candidates for religious vocations.

Dr. Anne Roat was quoted as saying anyone volunteering to be a mentor could take an online 45-minute webinar, and then expect to spend maybe 30 to 45 minutes per month on the phone, touching base with a

parish contact, monthly for 12 months. The purpose would be to see how they're PVM is coming along, see if you can answer any questions, and simply encourage them.

The **outline** Chuck distributed is an attempt to provide dozens of links related to promoting vocations, all in one document. This includes the Serra SPARK tools and videos; an explanation of the IGNITE Workshops; many PVM ideas; rules of thumb (such as the fact that 42% of vocation aspirants are blocked from pursuing vocation formation due to accumulated college debt, and how that can be addressed); Louisville Archdiocesan links on vocations; Louisville St. Serra Club links; books recommended to priests and discerners; quotes and Scripture verses on vocations; items helping parents of discerners; and other national links (e.g., Mass petitions and bulletin blurbs for vocations).

We also hope that any parishioners willing to help with vocations will consider joining our club, as well as using the outline - see the link above.

## VOCATION CHALLENGE COINS FOR YOUNG MEN

The St. Serra Club of Louisville has purchased Challenge Coins for young men. The idea is to give these coins to young men who may be good candi-

dates for the priesthood. Ideally, the coins would be given out by priests since studies show that being approached on the subject by a priest carries a lot more significance than being approached by a lay person.

Our local St. Serra Club is also giving to priests a book "Five Conversations About the Priesthood: A simple way for busy priests to help men discern" by Fr Mike Pratt – packed with ideas, yet only 36 pages, which can be read in about a half hour.

All priests in the Louisville Archdiocese have been contacted on this subject to see if they wish to receive five Challenge Coins and the book.
