Bob Hublar touched on a number of topics, starting with all that has happened since he became President



around 11 years ago. We have moved our meeting location from the U of L University Club. We had to deal with the Covid pandemic, and even had some of our meetings by Zoom.

We had to skip the Christmas Women Religious Luncheon some years due to the pandemic. But we tried to make up for it by purchasing boxes of candies, adding a note drafted by Fr. Pat Dolan,

and had members deliver them all over the archdiocese. Although we've brought back the December Sisters' Luncheon, we are still delivering the boxes of chocolates.

We started back up the Vocation Poster and Essay Contest; and it ended up being adopted by the USA Council of Serra to be added to the <u>S.P.A.R.K.</u> pro-

gram.

We started having a monthly Rosary for Vocations, by Zoom during the pandemic, and have continued it ever since, on the second Monday of each month.

We started a monthly Holy Hour for Vocations,



now held on the second Wednesday of each month, after the noon Mass in the chapel of St. Margaret Mary parish. Bob even arranged for us

to also have the Holy Hour for Vocations once a year with the upper grade students at St. Albert the Great parish. The teachers and students led the prayers for the Rosary. This has been going on each of the last three years.

We also started offering a retreat for members as well as non-members. These have been very well received.

Some parishes and schools use the Traveling Chalice or Crucifix program for vocations; and we hope to get more groups involved.

We worked with both the Vocation Office and the USA Council of Serra to host an IGNITE Workshop in Louisville, to help train parishes on how to start a Parish Vocation Ministry. We hope to put on more of these workshops in the future.

Bob reminded us to never underestimate the power of prayer.

He also complimented the Vocation Office staff and Fr. Martin Linebach, Vicar for Vocations and Director of Vocations, for the great job they have been doing.

Bob felt very confident that we will continue to see good things happening with vocations in our archdiocese.

Speaking of the June 1 ordination of five new priests, Bob said that we can all see the fruits of our labors; and he said he'd like to think, "I played a little part in that person becoming a priest."

We want to thank Bob Hublar for his leadership and all he has done in his 11 years as President!

Chuck also commented on a few other things that happened during Bob's presidency. We've had a change in Archbishops, the death of Chaplain Fr. Joe Voor at age 97, the addition of a new Chaplain, Fr. Pat Dolan, as well as an Assistant Chaplain, Fr. Jeff Hopper.

We experienced several changes in the Vocation Directors.

Unfortunately, we've had around two dozen Serrans, as well as Chaplain Fr. Joe Voor, who passed



away in those 11 years. Fortunately, we have kept our membership numbers about where they were 11 years ago.

We now have the monthly, national Serra Meets Zoom meeting, which was started during the pandemic and is still going on.

The USA Council now promotes Challenge Coins, which we've purchased and continue to distribute to

priests and deacons.

In 2023, for the first time, we had paying sponsors for a Retreat and for the December Women Religious Luncheon. As a result, in 2023, our club was able to give to the Vocation Office over \$8,000 – more than we've ever given in Chuck's memory of 17 years of membership.

We've developed a great board; and thankfully, they're all staying on for the coming year, even though some are changing positions. And we're adding Lincoln Lewis to that august group of leaders.

Chuck said that Bob Hublar has been a great inspiration and a mentor to him; and he's glad Bob will continue as a member of the Board.

He also gave some thoughts about the coming year. Regarding the IGNITE Workshop, we expect to have our second one – reaching additional parishes about establishing Parish Vocation Ministries – sometime this fall.

We'll be looking for volunteers with various activities, including the next IGNITE Workshop. (And Chuck said not to forget - studies show that 80% of priests come from the 20% of parishes that have some sort of a program to promote vocations.) The Next Retreat has not yet been scheduled; but we'll definitely need help. We still want to continue promoting the Challenge Coins. We'll need help recruiting sponsors for the retreat and the annual Women Religious Christmas Luncheon.

We want to continue strengthening, as Bob did, our relationship with Archbishop Shelton Fabre's

office and the Vocation Office.

And we continue to increase people's awareness of our club, so they're less likely to confuse us with the Sierra Club. Chuck said our newsletter now goes to 2,300 people.

We will continue encouraging member prayers for vocations - Eucharistic Adoration for Vocations, Zoom Rosaries for Vocations, Seven Serrans prayer group (people picking a specific day of the week to pray one hour for the Vocation Director and the staff of the Vocation Office).

Chuck spoke of one of his favorite verses in the Bible - "Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer." (Romans 12:12). He said it reminds him of the nature of all Serra Clubs. <u>Hoping</u> for an increase in vocations, especially to the priesthood. <u>Suffering</u> because our country continues to experience a priest shortage. <u>Praying</u> for vocations because we know prayer works.

Although we ordained five new priests last month, we've already heard from Fr. Martin Linebach that there will be at least six new seminarians this fall. Fr. Martin said there are also some others still applying and being considered.

So, like Bob, Chuck said he's excited about all that can happen in the coming year.

JULY 13 ZOOM MEETING FOR "SERRA MEETS"

Our speaker for this 43rd Serra Meets was Fr. Thomas Gibbons, CSP, of the Paulist Fathers, the first religious order of men to come (in 1858) to the United States.

"I do not feel these divides can be overcome."

Fr. Tom, age 52, lives at St. Paul the Apostle Catholic Community in Los Angeles, of which he is a past associate pastor. He has been a member of his order for 18 years and was ordained a priest in 2012.

For the last eight years, Fr. Tom has worked in media productions, including works aired through the **Public Broadcasting Service**.

While working on a documentary about Fr. Kieser (1929-2000), being rolled out as "Fr. Bud, Hollywood Priest," and hearing of Confederate statues coming down, he decided to investigate stories on the statues of St. Junipero Serra which were being vandalized or torn down in California. He found our nation is increasingly polarized.



He discovered a NY Times bestseller book, "Love Your Enemies: How Decent People Can Save America from the Culture of Contempt" by Arthur Brooks, about all the disagreements in the country, and our need for more goodwill conversations.

In the wake of the death of George Floyd in May 2020, the nation

had entered a deeper conversation on issues of civil rights. But in the wake of that conversation, controversies surrounding the legacy of Saint Junipero Serra have also risen to the surface and with it, concerns about historical preservation and religious freedom.

To this end, <u>Paulist Productions</u> has more fully explored the legacy of St. Junipero Serra along with a renewed historical appreciation of native peoples, presented in a documentary project entitled

> "Junipero Serra: Statue of Limitations," (the link includes a 2-minute trailer). Top scholars representing many different perspectives have contributed to the project so that we can gain a fuller understanding of the major issues that lie beneath the usual talking points regarding Father Serra's legacy.

The main questions they are attempting to answer with this film are (a) When do we *judge* the past... and when do we *defend* the past? And (b) How

can we *heal*... and what does *moving forward* look like?

Fr. Tom found that rabble-rousers were not interested in conversation, but only in tearing down statues. He said there are many people whose attitude is, "I love, but THEY hate." or, "I'm good, but THEY are bad." He found people who disagree on issues and are treating each other as enemies.

The presentation that Fr. Tom made included some great slides and statistics on ideological differences and polarization in the world. Interestingly, two of the most polarized countries in the world are the U.S. and Argentina, from where Pope Francis came. (See chart.)

Fr. Tom spoke of there being "Bonders" and "Bridgers". The bonders just want to stick with their team. The bridgers ask - who might we be able to connect to our point of view?

Arthur Brooks' book talks about America being a culture of bridgers. In Ventura, CA, it was decided to listen to both sides of the argument and then put up to a vote the issue about the future of the statues.

Since St. Serra founded what is now the town of Ventura, CA, where there are statues of St. Serra, this whole debate was a big one – primarily between a popular pastor and a representative of one of the tribes of Native Americans.

In March of 2024, it was voted that the statues were to be removed from public property and transferred to a Catholic mission.

The documentary film, presenting both sides of the arguments about St. Serra, is being presented publicly in October of this year at the <u>Newport Beach Film</u> <u>Festival</u>. From there, Fr. Tom expects it could go to various platforms, such as PBS of Southern California, and then the national PBS station, possibly cable channels, and then eventually to YouTube.

Fr. Tom says the documentary will help with bridge-building between the two sides arguing over the history of St. Serra. And preliminary findings are that there are people on <u>both</u> sides thinking the film does too much for their opponents' arguments – which may indicate it is well balanced.

<u>NEWLY ORDAINED FR.</u> <u>MATTHEW MILLAY SPOKE</u> <u>AT OUR JULY 15 MEETING.</u>



Fr. Matthew H. Millay, 28, was ordained a priest on June 1 of this year, He is a native of Guston, Kentucky (about 15 miles west of Fort Knox). He is the second of four sons of Harold and Kimberly Millay who live on the family farm in Guston.

He has earned a Bachelor of Science in Biology from Western Kentucky University. He also earned a Master of Arts in Catho-

lic Philosophical Studies, and a Master of Divinity, both from Saint Meinrad Seminary and School of Theology in St. Meinrad, Indiana.

Fr. Matt now serves as the Associate Pastor of Holy Spirit Catholic Church and St. Leonard Catholic Church, both in Louisville.

He joined us to tell us of his vocation journey.

Fr. Matt said his earliest memories with some sense of a vocation come from time with his grandfather, who babysat him while his grandmother was still working. It was always a "great time." He recalls his whole family was most prayerful; and he also "played Mass" as a young child.

His mother even made him a Roman collar to wear to school for career day!

Fr. Matt's grandfather was a man of deep prayer and said the Rosary frequently. He was an example of what it means to "pray without ceasing." Saying the Liturgy of the Hours five times a day now, plus celebrating Mass, Fr. Matt says he is often reminded of his grandfather.

As a child, Fr. Matt felt he "really belonged" to his parents, grandparents, and the Church. As he later considered the priesthood, his parents were very supportive, even though they, like any parent of a discerner, were occasionally nervous.

Late in high school, while he felt very serious about the seminary, his parents suggested he wait a

while. So, he went to WKU, joined a fraternity, and participated in the activities of the campus Newman Center. Thinking he may get into dentistry, he majored in biology and minored in business and finance. For the ten years during college and seminary Fr. Matt and Fr. Kenny Nauert were very close friends, both being ordained at the same time.

Fr. Matt says that he learned what freedom meant; and it was during his WKU years that the call to priesthood was clarified.

At St. Meinrad Seminary, he learned that "My time is not my own ... It belongs to God." He grew in selfunderstanding and spoke highly of the studies about being human (one of the four dimensions of seminary formation). The gift of self was one of the many things he learned.

He said the "priesthood is an immense gift to receive and to be shared. He's looking forward to the school year at Holy Spirit parish because he's already spent two years helping the parish and the school prior to ordination; and he really enjoys working with youth.

Fr. Matt says that he understands one of the big differences between seminary formation today versus many years ago is that previous generations of priests took a lot of English, liberal arts, history, etc. while many of today's seminarians come from a background in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM).

Having young grade schoolers think about vocations is what he recommends. If we wait until high school, then it's probably too late.

Talking about his role as an associate pastor, he tells his parishioners to contact him anytime. He says he was "ordained for interruptions."

We want to thank Fr. Matt for speaking with us about his vocation journey.
