# ORDER FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A PASTOR

#### INTRODUCTION

Book of Blessings nos. 2012-2021

- 1. The archbishop is the usual celebrant of this Rite.
- 2. The archbishop is the celebrant of the Eucharist and the new pastor concelebrates with him.
- 3. The members of the Parish Council and the Parish Staff should be seated in the front of the church, and, if desired, may take part in the entrance procession.
- 4. The mass of the day is celebrated.
- 5. The required oath is signed after mass.
- 6. The new pastor may briefly address the people after the prayer after Communion.
- 7. According to pastoral circumstances the archbishop may adapt or omit particular elements of this rite.

# Presentation of the Pastor-elect

2022. After the gospel, the pastor-elect stands before the archbishop, who addresses the people in these or similar words:

My dear friends,
because I am aware of your pastoral needs
and am confident of Father qualifications
for the office of pastor, I now commend Father
to you as your new pastor.

WELCOME BY THE PEOPLE

2023. The archbishop may then invite the people to express their approval and support of their new pastor.

# HOMILY

2024. The archbishop in the homily, based on the sacred text and pertinent to the particular place and the people involved, explains the meaning of the celebration.

# Presentation of the Parish Clergy and Staff

The pastor stands before the archbishop.

The priests, deacons, and other members of the parish staff stand as they are presented to the new pastor by the archbishop:

, my brother, Father
Deacon , and
will assist you in the pastoral care of the people of this
parish. Share this ministry in a spirit of mutual trust,
common prayer, and genuine concern.

Presentation of the Parish Council

2027. The parish council stands and is presented to the pastor by the archbishop:

Father , this is the pastoral council of parish.

It is the voice of your people and will assist and counsel you as you minister to this parish. Always be attentive to the needs they express.

Then the pastor faces the parish council and says:

My friends, I pledge to seek your counsel, guidance, and advice in the spiritual and temporal care of my pastorate.

Profession of Faith and Oath

2029. Next the archbishop addresses the new pastor, who stands facing him:

Remember, my brother , always be a loving father, a gentle shepherd, and a wise teacher of your people, so that you may lead them to Christ who will strengthen all that you do.

As a teacher of that faith, I ask you now to lead your people in the procession of faith. I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven,

At the words that follow, up to and including and became man, all bow.

and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

With firm faith, I also believe everything contained in the word of God, whether written or handed down in Tradition, which the Church, either by a solemn judgment or by the ordinary and universal Magisterium, sets forth to be believed as divinely revealed.

I also firmly accept and hold each and everything definitively proposed by the Church regarding teaching on faith and morals.

Moreover,
I adhere with religious submission of will and intellect

to the teachings which either the Roman Pontiff or the College of Bishops enunciate when they exercise their authentic Magisterium, even if they do not intend to proclaim these teachings by a definitive act.

2031. The archbishop introduces the general intercessions using these or similar words. Additional intentions may be added, if desired.

Let us now pray for the Church and its leaders, especially the new pastor of this parish, and for the needs of all people.

For ourselves, that we who form the parish of may work together to proclaim the good news of Christ's love, we pray to the Lord. R

2032. The archbishop then says the concluding prayer:

Gracious God,
you have nourished and protected your Church
by providing it with pastors who are stewards of your word and
sacraments. Strengthen our brother as he
begins a new ministry among us, and help us all to follow your Son,
Jesus Christ, who is Lord, for ever and ever.

R Amen.

2033. The Mass continues with the preparation of the altar and the gifts.

The Oath of Fidelity is signed after Mass in private.
