Although retired deacons may not hold canonical positions within parishes or institutions, they may maintain archdiocesan faculties. They may serve in a parish or institution with the consent of the pastor without prejudice to ensuring their ministry remains within the bounds of their health and family obligations. To validly witness marriages and baptize children under the age of seven, they are required to secure a specific delegation for each marriage and baptism liturgy.
